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
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Report from our ARS Rep

Report from the Treasurer January 2023

Happy 2023 to everyone. I'd like to thank everyone for their generosity during our end of year fund raising. Our end of year appeal brought in \$500.

At year's end, RSLI has an account balance of \$12,715.78. Our dues have brought in \$855. Our in-person playing meeting fees are averaging \$175 per session. Our expenses for the year are estimated at \$4020 for rent, conductor and admin fees, insurance, Meetup fees, Web fees, and the Huntington Arts Council.
